**Psalm 67**

- To the chief musician, on stringed instruments.
- A Psalm, a song perhaps as a harvest festival, Pentecost or Tabernacles. VS. 6
- But it also looks to the millennial reign.
- VS. 1-2 The petition for blessing.
- VS. 3-4 The plead to praise God.
- VS. 5-7 The product of praise.

**67:2** Your way - The need of a savior and repentance towards God.

**67:4** In the millennial reign.

**67:6** God will return everything back prior to the fall.

**Psalm 68**

- To the chief musician, a Psalm of David. a song.
- Some see it as a processional hymn used by the priest and worshippers on the way to the sanctuary. VS. 24-26
- Some references to Messiah, Psalm of God's glory and goodness.
- VS. 1-6 The present.
- VS. 7-18 The past.
- VS. 19-35 The future.

**68:1-3** God's faithfulness to Israel.

**68:4** Singing in worship is a tremendous way to rejoice.

**68:5** Pharisees neglected and abused the orphan and widows.  
-Ja. 1:27 Undeified religion is to visit orphans and widows in their trouble.

**68:18** Eph. 4:8, 1Pet.3:19-20. Lk. 16:19-31. 2Cor. 12:1-6, 5:1-8

**68:34-35** Confidence in God.

**Psalm 69**

- To the chief musician, set to the "Lilies", a Psalm of David.
- Psalm of individual deep despair and agony due to relationship with God.
- Messianic in nature going beyond the Psalmist.
- VS. 1-6 Complaint.
- VS. 7-12 Cause.
- VS. 13-18 Appeal.
- VS. 19-28 Vengeance
- VS. 29-36 Deliverance.

**69:2** Jeremiah was put in a cistern and left to die.

**69:4** Jn. 15:25

**69:5** God sees my attitudes and actions which are foolishness because of who I am In God and what I know that He can do in me.

**69:9** “Jn. 2:17” Jesus cleansed the temple “Rom. 15:3”

**69:21** All four gospels.

**69:22** “Rom. 11:9-10”

**69:28** Book of the living Ex. 32:32; Rev. 3:5; 13:8; 20:12

### **Psalm 70**

-Psalm of David to the chief musician.

-Psalm to bring to remembrance of personal lamentation and anxiety over persecution by the enemy.

-Nearly identical to Ps. 40:13-17.

-VS. 1-3 Cry for help.

-VS. 4-5 Cry of confidence.

### **Psalm 71**

-The only Psalm of book II without a title. except Ps. 43, which is thought to be part of Ps.41.

-Prayer and testimony of an aged man’s confidence in God

-VS. 1-8 God his rock.

-VS. 9-13 God his help.

-VS. 14-21 God his hope.

-VS. 22-24 God his praise.

**71:3** Resort continually

**71:8** Acknowledgment of life In the womb.

**71:9** Only God knows what old age holds for each of us if He should tarry.

**71:14** A growing relationship even In old age.

**71:20** Resurrection.

### **Psalm 72**

-Psalm of Solomon as Ps.127.

-Psalm is twofold, to earthly king and Messiah.

-VS. 1-7 Prayer for righteous judgment.

-VS. 8-14 Prayer for dominion and peace.

-VS. 15-17 Prayer for preeminence.

-VS. 18-20 Doxology.

**72:1-4** King was to depend on God as faithful representative of God.

**72:8-11** Solomon, ultimately Jesus.
