-Psalm of David

-David expresses how he will live his life before God by ~ of promises to God.

-VS—1-4 The conduct of his private life as ~ believer.

-VS—5-B The conduct of his public life as official king.

101:1 David knew much about God's mercy over

his life as well as the justice of God.

-Sparing his life from Saul and Achish.

-Exposing his sin by Nathan.

101:2 His walk in his home and family.

1) wisely in a perfect way

(blameless).

-Dealing with Issues and resolving them.

2) Perfect heart - complete. Bold out.

. 101:3 I will not tempt myself by some worthless thing to fall away.

-Rom.13:14 make no provisions.

101:5 David now promises God how he will deal with those in his kingdom. by the same standard God requires of him.

-He will oppose the wicked.

101:8 Protect and defend the righteous.

101:7—8 Removal of all the evil.

Psalm 102

-Psalm is a prayer of the afflicted, when he is overwhelmed and pours out his complaint before the Lord.

—Personal lament with plead for the nation.

-5th of penitential Psalms.

-VS—1-11— The suffering of the psalmist.

-VS-12-22 The restoration of the nation.

-VS-23-28 The confidence of the psalmist.

—2— 102:1—2 Urgency of help

102:4—5 Lack of food because of desire is gone

and weight has been lost.

. 102:6—9 Loneliness and sorrow.

102:10—11 God has chastened him for sin.

102:12 Turns to restoration of Zion.

102:23—27 Man's temporal existence In contrast to God' eternal existence.

102:25—27 Quoted in Heb.1:10—12,13:8 to Christ.

Psalm 103

-Psalm of David

—Psalm is the purest of praise in the Psalms.

-VS-1-5 Personal praise.

—VS—~12 Past blessing.

-VS-13-18 Present chastening, love.

—VS-19—22 Praise for God's sovereign rule.

. 103:1—2 David exhorts and reminds himself of the need to bless the Lord for all His benefits. 103:3—5 Recalls some

103:8—10 Turns to God's past blessings.

103:12 Mic.7:19 In the depth of the sea.

*Not North and South

103:13—14 God pities those who fear Him and remembers our frailty and weakness.

103:19—22 Universal praise to God commanded.

-Psalm of praise to God for His creation and providence.

—VS-1-2 God's majesty

-VS—3—23 God's creation

-VS—24-30 God's providence

—VS-31-35 God's glory praised.

Psalm 105

—Psalm 105—108 are comparison Psalms which close the 4th book of Psalms.

-Psalm 105 declares the faithfulness of God.

—psalm 108 declares the rebellion and failure of people.

—VS-1-6 Call to thanksgiving.

—VS—7—22 Faithful to His covenant.

—VS—23—38 Faithfulness to multiply them.

-VS-39-45 Faithful to lead them, Israel.

105:2 Too often we become silent or Indifferent. to all that God has done for us as if it is nothing.

105:8 Abraham, Gen.12.

105:17—22 Joseph

105:23 God multiplied them and delivered them.

105:39 God led them by His personal presence and provided for them.

—Psalm declares God’s patience with Israel’s disobedience and failure.

—VS—1—8 Praise and Confession

-VS-7:33 Murmuring and disobedience

-VS—34-39 Backsliding and unfaithfulness

-VS—40-48 Chastening and mercy

—VS-47-48 Closing prayer and doxology
